PROCEDURES

- Everyday
 - Come in quietly and respectfully.
 - Get your supplies for the day out of your backpack.
 - Shapen your pencils before you sit down.
 - Hang up your backpack on the hooks in the back of the room. (Be sure all zippers are closed)
 - Start and complete the warm-up indepently.
 - Copy the objective from the board. Copy homework assignment(s) into planner.



HALLWAY BEHAVIOR

- Walk with hands behind your back
- Stand up tall with pride and attention
- Silently walk with mouth closed
- •Stay in the line the entire time with your class and your teacher







CLASSROOM RULES



- Be Responsible; follow all directions when given

VOICE LEVELS


- O = No Talking

- Hold up right hand

- As we say each "A, L, A" we hold 1, 2, 3 fingers.



TARDY TO CLASS

- Students are expected to be in class and seated on time

HOMEWORK BINDER

- Use your binder effectively.
- Divide the binder into all three STEM subjects: Science, Math and Coding/Engineering using dividers.
- Recommend using a zipper pouch that fits into your binder for pencils, color pens (red, purple, green and etc.) and two or three highlighters



LATE HOMEWORK

- All students are expected to be responsible for their assignments and obeying due dates.
- In the event of a late assignment:
 - Assignments will be accepted up to three days late
 - Each day late will earn a 20% deduction in credit
- Late assignments due to an excused absence will not have a penalty. Students will have an equal number of school days as days missed due to the excused absence to get missing assignments turned in.
